The Macon County Jail compliance monitoring was conducted on October 19, 2023. Entrance and exit interviews were conducted with Jail Superintendent Jamie Belcher, Assistance Jail Superintendent Clayton Barrows, and Sgt. Corey Maloney.

- 4) Briarwood Corrections Grade-Shank Free Cleaning Equipment (Entire jail)
- 5) 2 new capture shields (Intake)
- 6) New Dryer Nov 2022
- 7) Inmate personal mail scanning provider. (Off-site)
- 8) Established a 2-man dedicated transport team.
- 9) New religious leader. In person religious group sessions for various religions.
- 10) ADA compliant shower for new arrivals. (Intake)
- 11) IGA w/ Champaign Co. to house 20 inmates
- 12) Added additional shields to cells to prevent throwing material/liquids through food tray slot.
- 13) Deployed property containers in Pre-book to secure incoming inmates property in.
- 14) IRIS (Inmate Recognition and Identification System) by BI2 Technologies
- 15) Food Service Provider change to Summit.
- 16) Started Renew- Educational and addition recovery group for female inmates.
- 17) Replaced flooring and painted the Medical Department
- 18) Provide inmate workers \$10/week money on HomeWAV account for working.
- 19) Installed seatbelts in Transport Bus.
- 20) 10 new AED's put into service to replace outdated ones.
- 21) 4 floor mounted beds to prevent inmate concealment and self-harm. (4B-6F)
